Family Camp 2022

I feel like a broken record, but after a couple of years absence, Family Camp is back. As the title suggests, this is the chance for all you Beavers, Cubs and Scouts to bring your family to join in the fun and find out what 'scout camp' is all about.

We have managed to secure exclusive use of Dilston Scout Campsite near Hexham,

Friday 8th to Sunday 10th July. We've had some great family camps there in the past. The site is a huge flat field with a river running through the site. Fingers crossed the weather is on our side and we can make the most of the water – but for the 'glampers' among you, you will be pleased to hear there are hot showers and even plumbed toilets!

Cost will be around ± 30 per person for the weekend – the same for both children and adults. Children under the age of 6 can join us for ± 10 each. This includes a fun packed schedule as well as all your meals on Saturday, and breakfast and lunch on Sunday.

All adults staying overnight will need to be DBS checked by us. We will be in touch after you book to start the process.

Sorry – No camper vans or caravans on site. There's a small car park you may be able to camp in but if it's full, the overflow car park is off site and not a nice place to camp.

We have a limited number of tents we can loan out. Please just ask.

Unaccompanied scouts can come along. They can sleep in our patrol tents. Scouts who attend with their family can also join them (room permitting).

Explorer Scouts can also come along unaccompanied. They can choose to join us on the camp crew (running activities and keeping the site going) at a discounted price (TBC).

We've confirmed with the site, but unfortunately dogs are not allowed on site.

Bookings will open as soon as we can get a form online and payments set up.
